Prof. J.N. Pal, Professor, Department of Archaeology, University of Allahabad was the key note speaker, who shared his valuable thoughts encompassing archaeological and historical prospects in the region of Allahabad. He shed Lights on numerous excavation sites in the region of Allahabad, which have greatly contributed towards developing and understanding on social, cultural and economic attributed of the era gone by. His deliberations also focused upon ancient Stone Age in which human beings created their tools with stones and other

rudimentary materials such as bones, ropes, leather, etc. and the Neolithic Period "new stone": during which there was an improvement in the technology and the creation of objects of objects with molten metals.

Ms Smita Mishra the convener of the programme laid emphasis on the need to increase awareness among the citizenry about the importance of heritage and the need to preserve it for the future



generations. Being a widely travelled individual, she shared her experience on heritage preservation as being practiced by countries like Turkey, Italy and Great Britain etc. Her deliberations also bought to the fore-front issues like heritage tourism, and its potential to be an avenue for economic growth and prosperity.
